However, one of my grandfathers is currently undergoing treatment for lung cancer, and needed someone to stay with him to enable him to remain in his home. Thanks to God's amazing providence, I was able to leave early and move to western Kansas to stay with him while he needs me. So that is where I will be for a few months, and what happens after that only God knows at this point. Probably some kind of full time ministry, but I will discover that later! I look forward to the great adventures I feel the Lord has in store for my future, and I hope you are excited for me, too!

The image of the "gate" or the "threshold" in Scripture and the intercession of St. Catherine of Siena have been especially important to me during this part of my discernment. St. Catherine was a lay Dominican, and is one of the patron saints of the Community of the Lamb. She both tended the sick and did hands on work with the poor, and influenced political leaders and engaged in the international politics of her time. The "gate" of the city is the meeting place of worlds; those who are at the gate belong to the city and the work of the city but are outside its fortifications. At this point, I feel there is a strong possibility that the Lord will call me to be dedicated totally to him while remaining in a lay state, potentially even becoming a "consecrated lay woman" in the Community of the Lamb. But for now, I am "putting out into the deep" and following his call step-by-step.
